

BUGGED!



Mosquitoes bother some people more than others. It might be a person's smell, the color of their clothing, or different scents of sprays or soaps. To help keep mosquitoes from bugging you, wear antiperspirant, loose-fitting, light-colored clothes, and make sure there's no standing water near where you are playing.

GROUP GAME: BUZZ, BUZZ, BUG

1. One player is the mosquito. The rest of the players stand in a line in front of with the mosquito.
2. The mosquito chooses something visible—such as boots, a hat, or the color blue—that more than one person in the group has. (The mosquito doesn't tell anyone what it is.)
3. The mosquito walks down the line. The mosquito says "bug" and does a silly dance in front of any player with that chosen thing. That player then gets in line behind the mosquito. If the player doesn't have it, the mosquito says "buzz" and moves on.
4. After the mosquito has buzzed or bugged everyone, the players that were buzzed try to determine what the bugged people have in common, and none of the buzzed people have.
5. The first person to guess right becomes the next mosquito.



Two-player game variation: The mosquito sorts a set of objects into the a "buzz" group and a "bug" group. The other player determines what all the objects in the "bug" group have in common.
