

Strange lights and noises were coming from an old, boarded-up house. Folks in the nearby town said it was haunted. I was curious and decided to investigate.


As soon as I saw the place, I knew there was no ghost. Someone was living there! How did I know? Check out this picture. How many clues can you spot?

But then I noticed something that gave me a new idea. One that was sure to work! So how did we get out?


Hint: Remember the big pile of dirt from all that digging?
